RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Permanent Land Restoration Code states that a portion of the Permanent Land Restoration Fund be set aside for scholarships for upper-level Tribal member college students pursuing a degree in Natural Resources or a related field; and
- WHEREAS, the Permanent Land Restoration Board met, and reviewed and selected students for scholarships awards for Spring Semester 2004 on Friday, January 09, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Permanent Land Restoration Board selected the following students for scholarship awards for Spring Semester 2004: Angeline P. Hoffman (Ph.D. Education-Language, Reading & Culture, University of Arizona), Nicholas C. Laluk (MS in Archaeologist), and Mrytis Susan (Construction Management, Mesa Community College); and
- WHEREAS, scholarship selections and the amounts of each scholarship was based on meeting the guidelines outlined in the scholarship application, academic achievement, and financial need.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the Tribal Permanent Land Restoration Board recipient selection of the scholarship from the Land Restoration Fund for Spring Semester 2004.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 14, 2004</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (f), (g), (h), (k), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
