

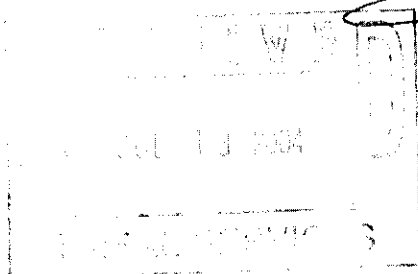
**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**


**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe finds that it is necessary that the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) maintains its road system throughout the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and that as part of such maintenance responsibility, some roads require blading due to tire ruts and residue which develop throughout the seasons; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council agrees that the following BIA roads require blading for proper maintenance: Stockman Road in Canyon Day, the road which connects Medicine Creek and Oak Creek in Cibecue, and the road which runs in close proximity to the residence of Scott Tenjieth.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Roads Maintenance blade the following BIA maintained roads within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation: Stockman Road in Canyon Day, the road which connects Medicine Creek and Oak Creek in Cibecue, and the road which runs in close proximity to the residence of Scott Tenjieth.

The foregoing resolution was on June 3, 2004, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
