

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(To combine resources for placement of waterline from Cedar Creek to Carrizo)

WHEREAS, members of the Carrizo community informed the Tribal Council this date of their many water problems; and

WHEREAS, homes in Carrizo have water that comes out of the tap black due to extremely high levels of iron and manganese; and

WHEREAS, the community has requested that a water pipeline be extended from Cedar Creek to Carrizo; and

WHEREAS, representatives from I H S Office of Environmental and from the Tribe's Utility Authority concurs that the best solution to the water problem is to run waterline from Cedar Creek; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports the community's request for waterline placement to resolve the serious water problems in Carrizo for the health and safety of the community.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the placement of a waterline from Cedar Creek to Carrizo.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that resources from Rodeo-Chediski donation fund, Housing Authority, I H S, BIA, WMAT, and Hon-Dah Casino be combined to fund the waterline placement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby seeks congressional appropriations for this effort as well.

The foregoing resolution was on April 6, 2005, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
