**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**(Authorizing Land Operations to implement a Feral Horse removal demonstration project)**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(f), the Tribal Council has the authority to protect and preserve the wildlife, plant life, forests, natural resources and water rights of the Tribe, and to regulate hunting and fishing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

**WHEREAS**, the range and grazing resources found in wild land areas on the Reservation are noted by the Tribe's Range Program to be depleting and deteriorating; and


**WHEREAS**, due to limitations of funding, some associations have deemed difficult to manage unauthorized feral horses; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tribe's Land Operations has proposed to remove feral horses and any proceeds will be reimbursed to offset all expenses incurred during the extent of this project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council finds that the removal of feral horses to be in the best interest of range management and the Tribe.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that the Tribe's Range Program is hereby authorized to remove feral horses from the Reservation, and that any proceeds from the sale be utilized to offset any and all expenses incurred thereby.

The foregoing resolution was on April 19, 2006, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
