



Resolution No. 07-2006-250

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Approving Expenditure of \$1,500 for Back-to-School Event for Each Community)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, representatives from East Fork Community did this day request funding for holding a back-to-school event; and

WHEREAS, other similar requests were made for established communities within each of the four Districts of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, funds are available within the Tribal Contributions Account; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that funding of up to \$1,500 for each of the established communities for the purposes described herein is appropriate and in the best interest of the Tribe.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Controller to set aside sufficient funds in the Tribal Contributions Account to make available up to \$1,500 per established community within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the purpose of funding back-to-school events.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence the Vice-Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on July 19, 2006, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (k), (s) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
