**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Approving the Tribal Member Hunting Regulations for 2006-2007, as amended herein)

WHEREAS, the Tribal Wildlife & Outdoor Recreation Division has come before the Tribal Council this date and requested approval of the Tribal Member Hunting Regulations for 2006-2007, copies of which are attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed recommended changes to the Tribal Member Hunting Regulations designed to provide sustainable management of Tribal wildlife resources; and

WHEREAS, the hunting seasons, bag limits and regulations are based on sound biological principle, survey and methods; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Tribal Member Hunting Regulations for 2006-2007, as amended herein, be approved.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the attached Tribal Member Hunting Regulations for 2006-2007, as amended herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence the Vice-Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on September 8, 2006, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (h), (i) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

TRIBAL-MEMBER HUNTING REGULATIONS 2006-2007**

Big Changes This Year:

- Tribal Members may only hold one (1) Elk tag per calendar year.
- The General Elk Season ends 7 days earlier.
- The number of General Elk tags has been reduced from 700 to 400.
- The Fall Bull Elk season ends 7 days earlier.
- There are an additional 5 tags for the Unit 8 Trophy Bull Elk – Archery hunt and an additional 3 tags for the Unit 8 Trophy Bull Elk – Rifle hunt.
- The area open to hunt for the Unit 8 Trophy Bull Elk – Archery hunt and the Unit 8 Trophy Bull Elk – Rifle hunt has been extended to include the area between Carrizo Creek and the Amos Wash road (R-9) and north of the Black & Salt Rivers in Unit 10.
- The Late Elk Season has been CLOSED.
- The Bighorn Sheep Season has been CLOSED.
- There is an additional tag available for the Pronghorn Antelope Zone 2 hunt.
- The Spring Gobbler hunt ends 7 days later.
- The Black Bear Season is now year round.

1. DEER

A. WHITETAIL DEER

SEASON DATES:

Dec. 9, 2006 through Jan. 7, 2007.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL DEER:

Antlered Whitetailed Deer (Buck) only.

560 issued on a first-come-first-served basis, (refer to section H2.B for details).

Nov. 11, 2006 through Nov. 26, 2006.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

Beginning in 2000 applicants successful in drawing a Unit 8 Trophy Deer Tag will remain ineligible for this draw for a period of one (1) year.

Hunters may hold either a Mule Deer tag OR a Whitetail tag OR a Unit 8 Trophy Deer tag OR a 55+ Deer tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD ANY COMBINATION OF THESE TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR.

D. 55+ DEER

One (1) per tag holder per year.

Any Antlered Mule Deer (Buck) **OR** Whitetail Deer (Buck) only.

Unit 8 ONLY. Please refer to map. The Unit 8 Trophy Bull Elk hunt area does not apply to this hunt.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

Beginning in 2000 applicants successful in drawing a Unit 8 Trophy Deer Tag will remain ineligible for this draw for a period of one (1) year.

Hunters may hold either a Mule Deer tag OR a Whitetail tag OR a Unit 8 Trophy Deer tag OR a 55+ Deer tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD ANY COMBINATION OF THESE TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR.

Any Antlered Mule Deer (Buck) **OR** Whitetail Deer (Buck) only.

55+ Deer tags will be sold on a first-come-first-served basis beginning September 15, 2006.

Tribal Members 55 years of age and older must present proof of

their age (Driver's License, Tribal or State ID) at the time of tag purchase.

55+ DEER TAG HOLDERS MAY NOT HOLD ANY OTHER DEER TAG(S) IN THE SAME YEAR.

E. ARCHERY DEER

SEASON DATES:

Oct. 13, 2006 through Oct. 25, 2006.

AND

Jan. 8, 2007 through Jan. 21, 2007.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL DEER:

Any Antlered (Buck) Deer. (Please see Special Regulations).

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

50 on a first-come-first-served basis, (refer to section H2.B. for details).

LEGAL TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

\$20.00.

OPEN AREAS:

Reservation wide **EXCEPT UNIT 8 and ZONE 3A.**

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

Archery Deer tags will be sold on a first-come-first-served basis beginning September 15, 2006. Archery Deer tag holders are not eligible for the general rifle Mule Deer OR Whitetail Deer OR 55+ Deer seasons (1A, 1B, and 1D. above). Archery Deer tag holders may take either an Antlered Mule Deer or Antlered Whitetail, not both. Archery Deer tag holders will be eligible for the Unit 8 Trophy Deer hunt (1C).

2. ELK

A. ARCHERY ELK

SEASON DATES:

Oct. 13, 2006 through Oct. 25, 2006.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL ELK:

Cow, Calf or Spike.

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

100, issued on a first-come-first-served basis, (refer to section H2.B. for details).

LEGAL TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

\$10.00.

OPEN AREAS:

Reservation wide **INCLUDING ZONE 3A.**

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

Archery Elk tags will be sold beginning September 15, 2006. **PERSONS ENTERING THE RODEO/CHEDISKI and/or THE KINISHBA BURN AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT PERSONS HUNTING THESE AREAS UTILIZE THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE GROUND FOR ENTERING, EXITING AND PARKING. B. GENERAL ELK

SEASON DATES:

Nov. 11, 2006 through Nov. 26, 2006.

BAG LIMIT: One (1) per tag holder per year.
LEGAL ELK: Cow, Calf or Spike.
NUMBER OF PERMITS: 400, issued on a first-come-first-served basis. (refer to section H2.B. for details).
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow as described in R1.B.
PERMIT COST: \$10.00, issued on a first-come-first-served basis (refer to section H2 and Exhibit I for details), **FREE** to Tribal Members handicapped or 55 years of age & older.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.
SPECIAL REGULATION: **PERSONS ENTERING THE RODEO/CHEDISKI and/or THE KINISHBA BURN AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT PERSONS HUNTING THESE AREAS UTILIZE THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE GROUND FOR ENTERING, EXITING AND PARKING. DUE TO THE POTENTIAL FOR FLASH FLOODING, PERSONS ENTERING THESE AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING SHOULD ALWAYS BE AWARE OF CURRENT AND POTENTIAL WEATHER CONDITIONS AND PLAN THEIR TRAVEL ROUTES ACCORDINGLY. C. JUNIOR RAGHORN BULL ELK

SEASON DATES: Nov. 4, 2006 through Nov. 26, 2006.
BAG LIMIT: One (1) per tag holder per year.
LEGAL ELK: A legal 'Raghorn Bull' is a bull elk having no broken points or antler beams that displays a maximum of four (4) points on either antler beam. The end, or terminating tip, of the main antler beam is counted as one (1) of the maximum four (4) points.
NUMBER OF PERMITS: 60, issued on a first-come-first-served basis, (refer to section H2.B. for details), to Tribal Members 10 through 16 years of age.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal firearm and/or bow and arrow as described in R1.B.
PERMIT COST: \$5.00
OPEN AREAS: Reservation Wide.
SPECIAL REGULATIONS: All successful hunters **MUST CHECK THEIR KILLS IN AT THE W&ORD OFFICE IN WHITERIVER. UNSUCCESSFUL HUNTERS MUST ALSO CHECK IN AT THE W&ORD OFFICE AT THE COMPLETION OF THEIR HUNT. HUNTERS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WILL BE INELIGIBLE FOR ANY HUNTS FOR A PERIOD OF 1 (ONE) YEAR.** Tribal Members ages 10 to 16 that have successfully completed an approved Hunter Education Course may obtain these tags every year as long as they do not turn 17 before or during the 2006 Junior Raghorn Bull season.

DUE TO THE POTENTIAL FOR FLASH FLOODING, PERSONS ENTERING THESE AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF

D. ZONE 1 FALL BULL ELK

SEASON DATES:

Nov. 18, 2006 through Dec. 3, 2006.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL ELK:

Any Antlered Elk.

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

75 issued by Draw, (refer to section H2.A. Exhibit I for details).

TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

\$50.00/\$5.00 Draw Application Fee.

OPEN AREA:

Zone 1 only.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

2005 Bull Elk tag holders are eligible for this hunt.

Hunters may hold either a Fall Bull Elk or a Trophy Elk - Unit 8 tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD BOTH TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR. See section H2 for application and Draw information.

E. ZONE 2 FALL BULL ELK

SEASON DATES:

Nov. 18, 2006 through Dec. 3, 2006.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL ELK:

Any Antlered Elk.

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

65 issued by Draw, (refer to section H2.A. Exhibit I for details).

TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

\$50.00/\$5.00 Draw Application Fee.

OPEN AREA:

Zone 2 only.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

2005 Bull Elk tag holders are eligible for this hunt.

Hunters may hold either a Fall Bull Elk or a Trophy Elk - Unit 8 tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD BOTH TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR. See section H2 for application and Draw information.

F. ZONE 3A FALL BULL ELK

SEASON DATES:

Nov. 18, 2006 through Dec. 3, 2006.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL ELK:

Any Antlered Elk.

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

45 issued on a first-come-first-served basis, (refer to section H2.B. for details).

TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

\$50.00.

OPEN AREA:

Zone 3A only.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

2005 Bull Elk tag holders are eligible for this hunt.

Hunters may hold either a Fall Bull Elk or a Trophy Elk - Unit 8 tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD BOTH TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR.

These tags will be available only to those Tribal Members who were not drawn for any of the 2006 Bull Elk hunts or did not purchase a 2006 Unit 8 Trophy Bull - Archery tag.

These tags will be available beginning September 15, 2006.

PERSONS ENTERING THE RODEO/CHEDISKI and/or THE KINISHBA BURN AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. IT IS HIGHLY

Any Antlered Elk.

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

35 issued by Draw, (refer to section H2.A. and Exhibit I for details).

TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

\$50.00/\$5.00 Draw Application Fee.

OPEN AREA:

Zone 3B only.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

2005 Bull Elk tag holders are eligible for this hunt.

Hunters may hold either a Fall Bull Elk or a Trophy Elk - Unit 8 tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD BOTH TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR. See section H2 for application and Draw information.

H. TROPHY BULL ELK - UNIT 8

SEASON DATES:

ARCHERY: Sept. 10, 2006 through Sept. 24, 2006.

RIFLE: Sept. 25, 2006 through Oct. 11, 2006.

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) per tag holder per year.

LEGAL ELK:

Any Antlered Elk.

NUMBER OF PERMITS:

18 Rifle issued by Draw, (refer to section H2.A. Exhibit I for details). 23 Archery issued on a first-come-first- served basis.

LEGAL TAKING DEVICE:

Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow as described in R1.B.

PERMIT COST:

RIFLE: \$130.00/ \$5.00 Draw Application Fee.

ARCHERY: \$130.00.

OPEN AREAS:

All of UNIT 8 and the area between Carrizo Creek and the Amos Wash road (R-9) north of the Black River and Salt Rivers in Unit 10. ONLY. Please refer to map.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

Hunters may hold either a Bull Elk or a Trophy Elk - Unit 8 tag, but ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO HOLD BOTH TAGS IN THE SAME YEAR. See section H2 for application and draw information. BEGINNING WITH SUCCESSFUL 2003 APPLICANTS, APPLICANTS SUCCESSFUL IN DRAWING A UNIT 8 RIFLE TAG WILL REMAIN INELIGIBLE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE (3) YEARS.

PERSONS ENTERING THE RODEO/CHEDISKI and/or THE KINISHBA BURN AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. PERSONS ENTERING THE RODEO/CHEDISKI and/or THE KINISHBA BURN AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT PERSONS HUNTING THESE AREAS UTILIZE THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE GROUND FOR ENTERING, EXITING AND PARKING. OPEN AREAS:

Reservation wide.

SPECIAL REGULATION:

PERSONS ENTERING THE RODEO/CHEDISKI and/or THE KINISHBA BURN AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT PERSONS HUNTING THESE AREAS UTILIZE THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE GROUND FOR ENTERING, EXITING AND PARKING. DUE TO THE POTENTIAL FOR FLASH FLOODING, PERSONS ENTERING THESE AREAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HUNTING SHOULD ALWAYS BE AWARE OF CURRENT AND POTENTIAL WEATHER CONDITIONS AND PLAN THEIR TRAVEL ROUTES ACCORDINGLY. 9. PREDATORS & FUR-BEARING ANIMALS

PERMIT NOT REQUIRED:

A. COYOTE, FOX, SKUNK, RINGTAIL CAT, RACCOON and BADGER

SEASON DATES: Yearlong.
BAG LIMIT: Unlimited.
PERMIT COST: None.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.

B. BOBCAT

SEASON DATES: Nov. 1, 2006 through March 31, 2007.
LEGAL BOBCAT: Any bobcat, except female with kittens.
NUMBER OF PERMITS: The reservation combined harvest quota for bobcat is 50.
PERMIT COST: Refer to Special Regulation.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.
SPECIAL REGULATION: **All bobcats harvested on the reservation must have an export tag attached to them. Export tags can be purchased at the W&ORD office for \$5.00.**

C. TRAPPING

SEASON DATES: Nov. 1, 2006 through Mar 31, 2007.
BAG LIMIT: The reservation combined harvest quota for bobcat is 50.
PERMIT COST: Refer to Special Regulation.
LEGAL TAKEN: Please refer to the 2006 - 2007 trapping regulations.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation Wide.
SPECIAL REGULATION: **A valid trapping permit must be obtained from the W&ORD. All bobcats harvested on the reservation must have an export tag attached to them. Export tags can be purchased at the W&ORD office for \$5.00.**

10. SMALL GAME

SMALL GAME PERMIT NOT REQUIRED:

A. COTTONTAIL RABBITS

SEASON DATES: Oct. 28, 2006 through Feb. 21, 2007.
BAG LIMIT: Ten (10) per day.
POSSESSION LIMIT: Twice Daily bag limit after opening day, of which no more than 10 may be taken in one day.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.C.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.

B. TREE SQUIRRELS

SEASON DATES: Oct. 28, 2006 through Nov. 26, 2006.
BAG LIMIT: Ten (10) per day.
POSSESSION LIMIT: Twice Daily bag limit after opening day, of which no more than 10 may be taken in one day.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.C.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.

C. QUAIL

SEASON DATES: Oct. 7, 2006 through Jan. 21, 2007.
BAG LIMIT: Ten (10) quail per day.
POSSESSION LIMIT: Twice Daily bag limit after opening day, of which no more than 10 may be taken in one day.

LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.
LEGAL QUAIL: Gambel's and Mearns' quail.

D. BLUE GROUSE

SEASON DATES: Oct. 28, 2006 through Nov. 26, 2006.
BAG LIMIT: Three (3) per day.
POSSESSION LIMIT: Twice Daily bag limit after opening day, of which no more than 3 may be taken in one day.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.

E. OTHER MAMMALS & BIRDS

SEASON DATES: Yearlong.
BAG LIMIT: Unlimited.
LEGAL ANIMAL: Crows, sparrows and all mammals **EXCEPT** game mammals, fur-bearing mammals, predatory mammals, ferrets, wolves, jaguars, ocelots, coatis and any other species of bird and/or mammal protected by Federal, State and/or Tribal law.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal firearm and/or bow & arrow described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Reservation wide.

11. MIGRATORY BIRDS

A. DOVES and PIGEONS:

SEASON DATES: Generally in September. Specific, Federally approved season dates will be available in August 2006.
BAG LIMIT: Specific, Federally approved bag limits will be available in August 2006.
POSSESSION LIMIT: Specific, Federally approved possession limits will be available in August 2006.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Specific, Federally approved areas will be available in August 2006.

B. WATERFOWL:

SEASON DATES: Generally mid-November 2006 through mid-January 2007. Specific, Federally approved season dates will be available in August 2006.
BAG LIMIT: Specific, Federally approved bag limits will be available in August 2006.
POSSESSION LIMIT: Specific, Federally approved possession limits will be available in August 2006.
LEGAL TAKING DEVICE: Any legal weapon described in section R1.D.
OPEN AREAS: Specific, Federally approved areas will be available in August 2006.
SPECIAL REGULATION: **A Federal Duck Stamp and the use of non-lead shot are required to hunt waterfowl on the reservation. Please check with W&ORD office for additional waterfowl hunting information.**

HUNTING REGULATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

The following regulations and procedures apply to all Tribal-members and to Non-Members who have been granted hunting rights by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

R1. METHODS OF LEGALLY TAKING GAME

- A. BIG GAME, except Elk** may be legally taken with the following weapons:
- i. Center fire rifles, muzzle-loading rifles, and all other rifles using black powder or pyrodex.
 - ii. Center fire handguns and handguns of a caliber not less than .44 Magnum.
 - iii. Shotguns shooting slugs.
 - iv. Bows having a standard pull of forty or more pounds, using arrows with metal broadheads no less than 7/8-inch width cutting edges.
 - v. Javelina may additionally be taken with .22 rimfire magnum rifles and 5mm Rimfire rifles.
- B. ELK** may be legally taken with the following weapons:
- i. Center fire rifles having a caliber of .243 or greater. Illegal calibers include: .22, .22 Magnum, 5mm, .222 and/or .22/250.
 - ii. Bows having a standard pull of 50 or more pounds using arrows with metal broadheads having no less than 7/8-inch width cutting edges. **Mechanical broadheads of any type (broadheads having hinged/rotating blades) are prohibited.**
 - iii. Center fire handguns and handguns of caliber not less than .44 Magnum.
- C. SMALL GAME (EXCEPT MIGRATORY BIRDS, BLUE GROUSE AND QUAIL)** may be legally taken with the following weapons:
- i. Any firearm, bow and arrow, pneumatic weapon, or sling shot not prohibited in section R2.B. (below).
- D. MIGRATORY BIRDS and UPLAND GAME BIRDS** may be taken only with the following weapons:
- i. Shotguns NOT larger than 10 gauge shooting shot. Waterfowl hunting requires the use of shotguns NOT larger than 10 gauge shooting non-lead shot only.
 - ii. Bow and arrow not prohibited in section R2.B. (below).
- E. PREDATORY AND FUR-BEARING MAMMALS** may be legally taken with any firearm, bow & arrow or trap not prohibited in section R2.B. (below).
- F. OTHER MAMMALS AND BIRDS** may be taken during the season by any means not prohibited in section R2.B., except for foothold traps.

R2. HUNTING REGULATIONS

- A. HEADS** of all big game species must remain attached to the hide and be transported with the game carcass at all times, for field identification purposes.
- B. PROHIBITED WEAPONS, AMMUNITION and DEVICES:** The following devices and ammunition are prohibited for the taking of any wildlife on the Reservation and may not be possessed in the field while hunting.
- i. Fully automatic firearms, including firearms capable of selective automatic fire.

- ii. Tracer ammunition and full metal-jacketed bullets.
- iii. Shotguns larger than 10 gauge; shotguns capable of holding more than two shells in the magazine, unless plugged with a one-piece filler incapable of removal without disassembling the gun.
- iv. Semi-automatic centerfire rifles with a magazine capacity of more than five shells.
- v. Contrivances designed to silence, muffle, or minimize the report of a firearm.
- vi. Poisoned arrows, or arrows with explosive tips.
- vii. Crossbows and other bows having devices attached to hold to bow in drawn position are prohibited.
- viii. The use of artificial light to spotlight wild animals or birds is illegal.
- ix. Rifles and shotguns having total barrel length less than 24 inches.

C. TIME PERIODS FOR THE TAKING OF GAME

- i. Big game, wild mammals, and birds may be taken only during daylight hours, **DEFINED AS:** ½ hour before sunrise through ½ hour after sunset.
- ii. Migratory game birds may be taken only at such times as authorized by Tribal and Federal Laws.
- iii. Nongame mammals, predatory and fur-bearing mammals permitted under Tribal trapping regulations may be taken by trap day or night.

R3. SPECIAL REGULATIONS

A. NON-MEMBERS (anyone who is not a registered member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe) may not be in the field with Tribal Members during any of the Special Draw hunting seasons. Exempt from this regulation are immediate, non-member relatives of tribal-members such as husband, wife, children, brother or sister (immediate family).

B. DEFINITION OF A JUNIOR: To qualify for a junior permit the individual must be a bonafide tribal member, between the ages of 10 and through the calendar year of their 16th birthday and successfully complete an approved hunter education course.

C. BLAZE ORANGE At least one (1) of the following items of blaze orange clothing must be worn at all times by all tribal members participating in any of the Tribal Member Big Game hunts: Hat, Bandanna, Vest, Pullover, Jacket, Coveralls, & Pants. Blaze orange is not required for the following hunts: **1E., 2A., 2I. ARCHERY and 5B.**

D. JUVENILES The minimum age requirement to obtain a Tribal hunting tag or permit of any kind is 10 years old, subject to the Juvenile's mandatory successful completion of an approved hunter education course. All hunters under the age of eighteen (18) years must be accompanied by an adult while in the field.

E. HUNTER EDUCATION COURSE REQUIREMENT: Tribal-member hunters born after

December 31, 1980 may apply for all big game draw hunts, but must present a certificate or other proof of successful completion of an approved Hunter Education Course in order to obtain any Tribal Big Game permits.

- F.** **ALL BIG GAME HUNTING PERMITS** must be validated, by signature, prior to entering the field and conducting any hunting activities on the reservation.
- G.** **GUIDING OR OUTFITTING FOR: TROPHY ELK/BIGHORN SHEEP/ANTELOPE/TURKEY/BEAR/MOUNTAIN LION on the Reservation** is strictly prohibited without proper registration/licensing through the White Mountain Apache Tribe W&ORD office.
- H.** **WHILE THE TROPHY ELK HUNT IS IN PROGRESS (SEPTEMBER 13 THROUGH OCTOBER 5, 2006), ALL UNITS EXCEPT UNITS 8 & 10 ARE CLOSED TO ALL TYPES OF HUNTING.**
- I.** **UNIT 8 IS NO LONGER CONSIDERED PART OF ZONE 1. UNIT 8 IS ONLY OPEN TO PERSONS HUNTING UNIT 8 TROPHY ELK, UNIT 8 TROPHY DEER, GENERAL ELK, FALL TURKEY, SPRING GOBBLER, BLACK BEAR and MOUNTAIN LION. UNIT 8 IS CLOSED TO ALL OTHER BIG GAME HUNTING.**
- J.** **SPOTLIGHTING OF ANY TYPE IS PROHIBITED.**
- K.** **ALL BIG GAME HUNTING PERMITS** must be validated by the Holder, by signing the tag, prior to entering the field and conducting any hunting activities on the reservation. In addition, **all game must be tagged immediately after the kill** in accordance with instructions on the tag.
- L.** **PORTABLE TREE STANDS** are allowed for archery hunts only. Stands must be completely removed by the hunter at the end of the season for which the stand is being utilized. Permanent stands of any form are strictly prohibited.
- M.** **ALL FORMS OF BAITING and BAITING CONTRIVANCES ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED.**

H1. TAG/PERMIT INFORMATION

- A.** **ALL HUNTING TAGS MUST BE PICKED-UP IN PERSON AT THE W&ORD OFFICE IN WHITERIVER (Office hours are 8am to 5pm, Monday through Friday).** A Tribal I.D. card or Affidavit of Tribal Membership (from B.I.A. or Tribal Council Secretary) must be presented at the time of application, or when tags are purchased.
- B.** **PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED AND SENIOR CITIZENS (55 and older)** will be issued permits for the following hunts free of charge: **General Elk (2B), Fall Turkey (5A) and Black Bear (7)**. Physically handicapped and senior citizens are eligible for a 50% discount on all Special Draw hunt permits.
- C.** **DUPLICATE TAGS WILL NOT BE ISSUED.** It is your responsibility to take care of your tags.

- D. TRANSFER OF TRIBAL-MEMBER HUNTING TAGS** is allowed and is subject to a \$50.00 transfer-processing fee. Hunting tag transfers are limited to one (1) per tag. Hunt applications are required of all persons accepting transferred hunt tags. Only the person to whom the tag was transferred will be subject to any applicable waiting period(s). Tag transfers must be completed on or before the day before the start of the hunt for that particular tag.
- E. MULTIPLE ELK TAGS:** Tribal Members may only hold one (1) elk tag per calendar year.
- E. HUNTER QUESTIONAIRES** must be completed from the previous years by all 2005 big-game tag applicants before any 2005-2006 Big Game applications are accepted.

H2. HUNT APPLICATIONS AND DRAWINGS

- A. EXHIBIT I All draw hunts (hunt numbers: 1B, 1C, 2E, 2F, 2G, 2H, 3 and 4).**
 1. **1B - MULEDEER** – 180 tags issued by draw, 55 in Zone 1, 80 in Zone 2 & 45 in Zone 3B.

Successful applicants may purchase their tags beginning September 15, 2006. All other non-draw hunt tags may be purchased beginning September 15, 2006 unless otherwise indicated herein.
- C. DRAW TAG PURCHASE DEADLINE INFORMATION**
The **deadline to purchase all draw tags, except Unit 8 Trophy Bull Elk Rifle, Pronghorn Antelope and Bighorn Sheep**, is the close of business **Friday, October 13, 2006**.
- D. HUNT DRAW METHODS**
All hunt tags issued through Draw (hunt numbers: 1B, 1C, 2D, 2E, 2G, 2H Rifle and 3) are conducted through a live random draw of hunt applications that are mailed or hand-delivered to the W&ORD office in Whiteriver on/before applicable hunt application deadline dates. All draw applications must be accompanied by a **non-refundable \$5.00 application fee**, which is due at the time of application. The drawing will be held on Wednesday, August 30, 2006 at the Veteran's Building in Whiteriver. Applicants need not be present to be drawn. **The drawing will follow the following order: Pronghorn Antelope, Unit 8 Trophy Elk, Unit 8 Trophy Deer, Fall Bull Elk and Mule Deer.** A list of all successful applicants and alternates for each respective draw hunt will be posted outside the W&ORD office in Whiteriver on Monday, September 4, 2006.
- E. UNCLAIMED/LEFTOVER SPECIAL DRAW TAGS** will be issued by a alternate draw list for each hunt, **not on a first-come-first-served basis**. The amount of time an alternate or group of alternates has to pick up their tags will be determined by the number of unclaimed/left over tags and the number of alternates for a particular zone. If all available tags for a particular zone hunt are not sold before the first day of the season to all successful applicants and alternates for that zone hunt, alternates from other zones for that particular hunt may purchase any available tags. Hunt applications will be required at the time of purchase of alternate draw hunting tags and will include a \$5.00 fee.
- F. Only ONE (1) application** will be accepted for any special draw hunt, i.e., you may not apply for all three zones for the Bull elk and Mule Deer draws.

- G.** If you are successfully drawn for a Fall Bull Elk and/or a Mule Deer permit **YOU MAY NOT SWITCH ZONES!**

This booklet is a synopsis of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hunting regulations and does not contain all of the laws and regulations relating to hunting, fishing and recreation. For complete laws and codes, consult the White Mountain Apache Tribe Game & Fish Code or contact the White Mountain Apache Tribe Wildlife & Outdoor Recreation Division Law Enforcement Department. These regulations apply to all enrolled members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and those non—members who have been granted Tribal Member hunting rights by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
