

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Approving Professional Services Agreement with University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill for Motor Vehicle Crash Study – Addendum for Year 3)

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 09-2003-228, the Tribal Council did approve grant application to the Center for Disease Control, entitled, "Evidence-based motor vehicle crash prevention strategies", which was subsequently approved by the CID; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 11-2006-390, the Tribal Council did approve a Professional Services Agreement with the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill which was signed on May 11, 2006, and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 05-2007-188, the Tribal Council did approve an Addendum to the Professional Service Agreement with the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, extending the contract term to September 30, 2007, and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to said grant, the Tribe is required to review data and procedures and prepare an evaluation plan of its crash prevention strategies for the purposes of identifying better, life saving strategies; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that an amendment to the Professional Services Agreement with the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is necessary to complete the study, and such agreement shall be in the best interests of the Tribe and automobile safety; and
- WHEREAS, because this Agreement will expire before the next regularly-scheduled Council meeting, the Tribal Council further finds that the Addendum for Year 3 of the Crash Study needs to be considered and made outside of its regularly scheduled meeting; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that: (1) this Resolution may be voted upon by signature of a member of the Tribal Council where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to

obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that:

- 1. A professional services agreement between the Tribe and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is hereby approved.
- 2. The agreement shall (a) not exceed \$11,000.00; (b) include a term through September 30, 2008; (c) be subject to the terms and conditions of the CDC grant and available funds. In the event that an additional extension of the Agreement is required to complete the Scope of Work, a modification for such purpose is hereby authorized, subject to availability of funds.
- 3. The Chairman, or in his absence the Vice-Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that given the urgency of the request described herein, this Resolution may be voted upon as follows: (a) by signature of a member of the Tribal Council, including the Chairman of the Tribal Council and the Vice-Chairwoman of the Tribal Council, where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (b) the Tribal Council Secretary shall attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (c) no signature shall mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (d) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature, and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 24, 2007</u>, adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Sections 1 (a), (b), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

ADDENDUM TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AT CHAPEL HILL

This Addendum shall apply to and become part of the attached Professional Service Agreement with the effective date of April 1, 2006 (the "Agreement") by and between the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill ("UNC-CH") and the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe"). The Agreement is hereby amended by the addition of the following provisions thereto, which shall be deemed incorporated therein and made a part of the Agreement:

- 1. The contract term shall be extended one year from October 1, 2007 to September 30, 2008.
- 2. The expenses for Year 3 shall not exceed \$11,000.00, as detailed in the original Scope of Work.
- 2. In the event of any inconsistency or conflict between the provisions of the Agreement and this Addendum, the provisions of this Addendum shall govern and control.
