

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Approving Application for a Native American Graves Protection & Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) grant to Fund the All Apache Summit)

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has offered consistent support for the conservation of cultural, historical, and archaeological sites and sacred objects according to Apache principles of respect, avoidance, and education; and
- WHEREAS, the Native American Graves Protection & Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) allows for the repatriation of certain cultural items, cultural affiliated remains, and objects of cultural affinity to be returned to the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the National Park Service (NPS) of the United States Department of Interior sponsors a grant program affecting repatriation under NAGPRA; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, pursuant to prior resolutions, has authorized the Historic Preservation Office to apply for previous NAGPRA grants from NPS; and
- WHEREAS, the Cultural Resource Director, Tribal Historic Preservation Officer and Cultural Advisory Group provides their expertise bringing sacred objects, objects of cultural patrimony, and human remains from museums nationwide; and
- WHEREAS, the grant will pay for three museum visits, help in sponsoring the All Apache Summit next year that includes NAGPRA training and policy formulation, and attending ten Western Apache NAGPRA Working Group meetings; and
- WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Office has successfully received two previous grants from NPS pertaining to NAGPRA, and successfully managed these grants; and
- WHEREAS, after careful consideration and review, the Tribal Council finds the application for Fiscal Year 2008 NAGPRA grant to be in the best interest of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the NAGPRA application requires approval prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Tribal Council, and given the urgency of the application deadline, the Tribal Council further finds that the NAGPRA grant application needs to be considered and made outside of its regularly scheduled meeting; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that: (1) this Resolution may be voted upon by signature of a member of the Tribal Council where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the

Tribal Council personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby:

- 1. The application for Fiscal Year 2008 NPS NAGPRA grant is hereby approved.
- 2. The Tribal Council hereby certifies that the application is consistent and compatible with the WMAT NAGPRA Policy, Inter-Apache Policy on Repatriation and the Protection of Apache Cultures, and all Heritage Program Policies.
- 3. The White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby agrees to comply with all appropriate procedures, guidelines, and requirements established by the NPS as a part of the application process.
- 4. The Tribal Council hereby certifies that the White Mountain Apache Tribe Historic Preservation Office will comply with all appropriate state and federal regulations, policies, guidelines, and requirements as they relate to the application.
- 5. In the event that grant funds are received, a budget for expenditure by the Historic Preservation Office is hereby authorized, subject to any applicable terms and conditions of the grant, and a review thereof by the Tribe's Legal Department.
- 6. The Tribe's Historic Preservation Officer and Cultural Resource Director are herein appointed as agents of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to assist with conducting all negotiations, and submission of all documents including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments, billing statements which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that the THPO shall, in consultation with the Cultural Resource Director, develop and implement programs and procedures to facilitate the representation of the interests of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in particular, and the Western Apache Nations in general, in respect to cultural patrimony, protection, repatriation, and preservation of Apache culture, human remains, and sacred objects now located beyond the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that given the urgency of the request described herein, this Resolution may be voted upon as follows: (a) by signature of a member of the Tribal Council, including the Chairman of the Tribal Council and the Vice-Chairwoman of the Tribal Council, where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (b) the Tribal Council Secretary shall attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (c) no signature shall mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (d) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no

signature, and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 21, 2007</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (g), (j), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
