



**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**(Authorizing a Request for P.L. 93-638 Contract for Law Enforcement)**

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the White Mountain Apache Tribe has managed the U.S. Department of Interior law enforcement program through a contract with the Secretary pursuant to the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638, 25 U.S.C. §450, et seq.), known as Contract No. CTH52T60720; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council finds that a proposal to the U.S. Department of Interior, through the Bureau of Indian Affairs, to contract the federal functions of law enforcement pursuant to P.L. 93-638 to be in the best interest of public safety and the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council further finds that the proposal should be in the form of an Annual Funding Agreement and Model Section 106 Contract, and should include provisions for a three-year duration and increased funding by the BIA over and above its current commitment.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that:

1. The Secretary of the U.S. Department of Interior, by and through the Bureau of Indian Affairs, is hereby requested to contract the federal functions of law enforcement, pursuant to the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L. 93-638, U.S.C. §450, et. seq.).
2. Said contract proposal should be in the form of an Annual Funding Agreement and Model Section 106 Contract, which should also include provisions for a three-year duration and increased funding by the BIA over and above its current commitment.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on August 11, 2008, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (c), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

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
