

## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

## (Financial Assistance and van for Gorbette Jones family)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council was informed that Tribal members Gorbette and Shar Jones' father had passed away in Crescent City, California; and

WHEREAS, they request financial assistance so that they can travel to California for the funeral and to pay their final respects to their father; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approves assistance of \$1,000.00 from the Tribal Contributions Account; and

WHEREAS, Council Member Alvin DeClay, Sr. will rent a van and pay for it via payroll deduction for the family's transportation to California.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby:

- 1. Approves financial assistance of \$1,000.00 from the Tribal Contributions Account.
- 2. Directs Council Member Alvin DeClay, Sr. to rent a van and make payment for it via payroll deduction to transport the family to California.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 3, 2009</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>NINE</u> for, <u>ZERO</u> against and ONE abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
