

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Authorizing Tribal Forestry P.L. 93-638 ARRA Contract With BIA)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all

matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe regularly enters into Public Law 93-638 Indian Self-

Determination Contracts with the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") to complete work and

projects that the Tribe is able to conduct; and

WHEREAS, the BIA has \$335,000.00 of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act ("ARRA") stimulus

funds available to transfer to the Tribe if it chooses to provide thinning for 800 acres of small

diameter wood in the South Faught Ridge areas; and

WHEREAS, all project work must be completed before September 30, 2010 and the wood biomass must also

accordingly be removed from the Forest in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, Tribal Forestry ("Forestry") does not have the machinery to haul the wood away so Forestry

recommends that the Tribe contract the work with the Fort Apache Timber Company ("FATCO") so that it may seek a suitable sub-contractor to carry out the thinning and also to haul the wood away, with a percentage of revenue from the biomass sale then paid to FATCO;

and

WHEREAS, Tribal Forestry further recommends that the Tribal Council authorize FATCO to sub-contract with the Fort Apache Restoration ("Restoration") for the purpose of thinning and hauling

with the Fort Apache Restoration ("Restoration") for the purpose of thinning and hauling material with a negotiated percentage of revenues paid FATCO through the Restoration's Biomass Crop Assistance Permit ("BCAP"), provided that the project may not be conducted

without the BCAP permit that would generate the revenue in question; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds it in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to authorize

Tribal Forestry to enter into a P.L. 93-638 ARRA contract with the BIA for the purpose of thinning in South Faught Ridge and to provide necessary biomass removal for completion of

the project; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that FATCO should be authorized to sub-contract work to

Restoration for the purpose of thinning and hauling of small diameter wood (biomass removal)

for the project referenced herein; and

WHEREAS, given the urgency of the need for available funds, the Tribal Council further finds that the new

P.L. 93-638 Contract request needs to be considered and made outside of its regularly

scheduled meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that: (1) this Resolution may be voted upon by signature of a member of the Tribal Council where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (2) the

Tribal Council Secretary should attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council

personally, (3) no signature would mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against

this Resolution, (4) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes Tribal Forestry to enter into this new P.L. 93-638 ARRA contract with the BIA for the purpose of thinning in South Faught Ridge and to provide biomass removal for the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes Tribal Forestry to contract with FATCO who will then sub-contract with the Fort Apache Restoration to thin and haul material with a negotiated percentage of revenue paid to FATCO through the Restoration's Biomass Crop Assistance Permit (BCAP).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that this authorization is conditioned upon Fort Apache Restoration's BCAP permit for generation of revenues and Tribal Forestry is hereby authorized to seek a suitable alternative if this condition is not met.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that given the urgency of the request described herein, this Resolution may be voted upon as follows: (a) by signature of a member of the Tribal Council, including the Chairman of the Tribal Council and the Vice-Chairwoman of the Tribal Council, where a signature indicates a vote for this Resolution, (b) the Tribal Council Secretary shall attempt to obtain signatures for members of the Tribal Council personally, (c) no signature shall mean that the respective Tribal Council member is against this Resolution, (d) the Tribal Council Secretary should wait no longer than a reasonable period of time to obtain a vote by signature or by no signature, and so indicate that this Resolution was presented to the respective member of the Tribal Council for a vote.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairwoman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on March 23, 2010, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (c), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
