

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Citizen Participation for the Memorial Hall Community Center and the Cibecue Safety Complex Building for the Indian Community Development Block Grant)

- WHEREAS, the Indian Community Development Block Grant ("Grant") requires citizen participation regarding the projects needed in their own communities; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe") has expressed many concerns, reasons and recommendations for supporting the need to restore Memorial Hall, as well as to erect a new Cibecue Safety Complex Building; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has spoken to the community on the radio, in person, through social media,, the Apache Scout Newspaper, and at community meetings about the Tribe's need to restore the Memorial Hall Community Center and to build a new Safety Complex Building; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council can declare, for the purpose of the Grant, that the White Mountain Apache Tribe has addressed the citizen participates requirements of the Grant..

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares that the citizen participation was instrumental in choosing the projects in support of the restoration of the Memorial Hall and for constructing a new Cibecue Safety Complex Building.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>JUNE 9, 2011</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
