

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Approving the Posting of Ordinance No. 241, Amending the Housing & Construction Code of the White Mountain Apache Tribe)

- WHEREAS, the Fire & Rescue Department and the Legal Department have this day proposed revisions to the Housing & Construction Code for the White Mountain Apache Tribe as set forth in Ordinance No. 241 attached hereto and incorporated by reference; and
- WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 241 proposes changes to Sections 1.2, 1.3, 2.2, 2.3, 3.2, 3.3, 4.2, 4.3, 4.5, 5.2, 5.3, 5.5, moving Chapter Six to Chapter Eleven, moving Chapter Seven to Chapter Twelve, moving Chapter Eight to Chapter Thirteen, and creating a new Chapter Seven, Eight, Nine and Ten; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article XV of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the proposed amendments shall be posted in each district for at least ten (10) days before final action by the Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Council has reviewed Ordinance No. 241 carefully, and considered the recommendations and the implications thereof in great detail and finds the adoption of updated housing and construction codes is in the best interest of the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that proposed Ordinance 241 attached hereto, which amends multiple sections of the Housing & Construction Code, is hereby recommended for posting by the Tribal Council.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, as follows:

- 1. The Tribal Council Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to post this resolution, Ordinance No. 241, in each district for at least ten (10) days before final action by the Council. In addition, notices of the proposed ordinance shall be sent in the form of a press release to KNNB-FM and the Apache Scout.
- 2. Any and all comments concerning Ordinance No. 241 proposed herein may be sent to the attention of the Tribal Council Secretary, White Mountain Apache Tribe, P. O. Box 700, Whiteriver, AZ 85941.

3. Upon completion of the posting period, the Tribal Council Secretary is further directed to submit proof of posting to the Tribal Council as well as the Legal Department and to report any public comments to the Tribal Council, and schedule a meeting thereof for final action.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall govern.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on **NOVEMBER 14, 2011** duly adopted by a vote of **FIVE** for, **ZERO** against and **ONE** abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (q), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

ORDINANCE OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE Ordinance No. 241, amending White Mountain Apache Housing & Construction Code to amend or add Sections 1.2, 1.3, 1.5, 2.2, 2.3, 2.5, 3.2, 3.3, 3.5, 4.2, 4.3, 4.5, 5.2, 5.3, 5.5, Chapter Six, Chapter Seven, Chapter Eight, Chapter Nine, Chapter Ten, Chapter Eleven, Chapter Twelve and Chapter Thirteen, as follows:

SECTION 1.2 <u>ADOPTION OF UNIFORM BUILDING CODE</u>

The Uniform Building Code, 1964 Edition, of the International Conference of Building Officials 2006 International Building Code of the International Code Council and any amendments thereto, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, and the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is approved.

SECTION 1.3 <u>EFFECTIVE AREAS</u>

The Uniform Building Code, 1964 Edition, 2006 International Building Code shall be effective in certain areas to be designated by the Tribal Council.

SECTION 1.5 <u>VIOLATION</u>; PENALTY

Any person, firm, or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this Code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this Code is committed, continued, or permitted, and upon conviction of any such violation such person shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2.2 <u>ADOPTION OF UNIFORM PLUMBING CODE</u>

The Uniform Plumbing Code, 1964 Edition, of the Western Plumbing Officials Association 2006 International Plumbing Code of the International Code Council, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, and the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is approved.

SECTION 2.3 <u>EFFECTIVE AREAS</u>

The Uniform Plumbing Code, 1964 Edition, 2006 International Plumbing Code shall be effective in certain areas to be designated by the Tribal Council.

SECTION 2.5 <u>VIOLATION; PENALTY</u>

Any person, firm, or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this Code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this Code is committed, continued, or permitted, and upon conviction of any such violation such person shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3.2 ADOPTION OF UNIFORM HOUSING CODE

The Uniform Housing Code, 1964 Edition, by the International Conference of Building Officials, 2006 International Residential Code of the International Code Council, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, and the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is approved.

SECTION 3.3 <u>EFFECTIVE AREAS</u>

The Uniform Housing Code, 1964 Edition, 2006 International Residential Code shall be effective in certain areas to be designated by the Tribal Council.

SECTION 3.5 <u>VIOLATION; PENALTY</u>

Any person, firm, or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this Code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this Code is committed, continued, or permitted, and upon conviction of any such violation such person shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 4.2 ADOPTION OF UNIFORM ELECTRICAL CODE

The National Electrical Code of 1965 2008 of the National Fire Protection Association, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, and the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is approved.

SECTION 4.3 EFFECTIVE AREAS

The National Electrical Code of 1965 2008 and amendments thereto shall be effective in certain areas on the reservation. Such areas to be designated by the Tribal Council.

- B. The Tribal Council considers it necessary to have a Uniform Fuel Gas Code in order to accomplish the above objectives.
- C. A Uniform Fuel Gas Code is considered necessary and in compliance with the reservation program and comprehensive neighborhood planning.

SECTION 8.2 ADOPTION OF FUEL GAS CODE

The 2006 International Fuel Gas Code of the International Code Council, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, and the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is approved.

SECTION 8.3 <u>EFFECTIVE AREAS</u>

The 2006 International Fuel Gas Code shall be effective in certain areas on the reservation. Such areas to be designated by the Tribal Council.

SECTION 8.4 <u>CONTRACTS</u>

All future contracts, leases and agreements with persons not under the jurisdiction of the tribal court shall have incorporated therein an agreement to abide by this code.

SECTION 8.5 <u>VIOLATION</u>; PENALTY

Any person, firm, or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this Code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this Code is committed, continued, or permitted, and upon conviction of any such violation such person shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
