Resolution No. 03-2013-57

(Prioritize 2013-14FY Community Block Grant for Cibecue School Construction)

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe") is aware that funds are available through a community development block grant for select purposes, as prioritized and determined by the Tribal governing body; and

WHEREAS, the funds are currently prioritized and allocated for specific purposes, however, according to Ms. Judy Dehose, former Council woman from Cibecue, the block grant would have been very beneficial in facilitating the construction of phase one of the Dishchii'Bikoh Middle School in Cibecue; and

WHEREAS, on behalf of the community of Cibecue and the middle school, Ms. Dehose requests that such funding be prioritized and allocated for the benefit of Cibecue and the school and they should receive strong consideration and high prioritization in the application process; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is in agreement that the community of Cibecue, and development of the Middle School is very important to the Tribe and finds that it would be in the Tribe's best interest to prioritize Cibecue and the school for CDBG funding in the fiscal year and application cycle that follows.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares that Cibecue should receive the highest consideration and prioritized for CDBG funding so that the middle school construction phase may be completed in a timely manner and so that the children of Cibecue may benefit from this much needed educational facility.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, this Resolution shall be declared null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Acting Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. In the event that the Chairman fails to delegate signatory authority to an Acting Chairman, the Vice-Chairman may sign.


The foregoing resolution was on March 13, 2013 duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Tribal Constitution, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
