Resolution No. 06-2013-128

(Authorizing Agreement between Head Start and the Child Care Program to Provide Early Childhood Development Services for 2013-2014 School Year)

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (“Tribe”) is entrusted by the Tribe’s Constitution to act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe, to manage all economic affairs and enterprises of the Tribe, and to regulate subordinate organizations for economic and other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program (“Head Start”) and the White Mountain Child Care Development Program (“Child Care Program”) both provide valuable early childhood development services to children of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, Head Start and the Child Care Program will collaborate their efforts for the 2013-2014 school year with respect providing quality early childhood development services, determining eligibility and enrollment for the programs and maintaining records for the use of Child Care Development Funds (CCDF); and

WHEREAS, Head Start and the Child Care Program are therefore authorized to collaborate services for the 2013-2014 school year.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes Head Start and the Child Care Program to enter into an agreement to provide quality early childhood development services, determine eligibility and enrollment for the programs and maintaining records for the use of Child Care Development Funds (CCDF) for the 2013-2014 school year.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, this Resolution shall be declared null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Acting Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all

documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. In the event that the Chairman fails to delegate signatory authority to an Acting Chairman, the Vice-Chairman may sign.


The foregoing resolution was on JUNE 5, 2013 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ONE against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (s), (t) and (u) of the Tribal Constitution, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

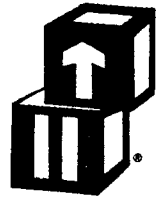

Inter Department Agreement between White Mountain Apache Head Start And White Mountain Apache Tribal Child Care Developmental Program

This agreement is made between the White Mountain Apache Head Start and White Mountain Apache Child Care Developmental Program. This Agreement is for the School year 2013 – 2014.

1. Purpose Statement

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish a working relationship to collaborate between White Mountain Apache Head Start and White Mountain Apache Tribal Child Care Development Program (CCDF) is provision of services of CCDF children.

2. Agreement


Child Care Development Program agrees to:

1. Be responsible for application and eligibility of children who meet CCDF standards.
2. Abide with all Head Start Enrollment policies and consult with Head Start Enrollment Advocate if changes should arise.
3. Enroll eligible children between the ages of 4-5 years old.
4. Pay the cost of services provided to CCDF children in collaboration with Head Start Program according to Child Care Development Funds Program guidelines.

3. Agreement

Head Start Program agrees to:

1. Keep an on-going enrollment with CCCDF of eligible children.
2. Maintain attendance and required CCDF documents.
3. Provide quality education to CCDF children
