

WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

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Resolution No.

(Approving Request to Transfer Houses to Division of Health)

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe") is entrusted by the Tribe's Constitution to act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe, to manage all economic affairs and enterprises of the Tribe, and to regulate subordinate organizations for economic and other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Whiteriver Service Unit of the Indian Health Service has indicated that the 28 government owned housing units located at city center will be demolished; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the current housing shortage on the reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that the 28 housing units are in need of a range of repairs from minor maintenance to major repair such as settling issues and roof repairs; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has identified Lead Based Paint and Asbestos Containing Materials in varying amounts throughout the buildings. The Indian Health Service will abate the Lead Based Paint and Asbestos Containing Materials but will not replace the abated materials. The Tribe is aware that the buildings are to be transferred in an abated state. Some units will require extensive abatement to result in the absence of drywall, flooring, siding and shingles; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that the Indian Health Service will not address the these repairs but that such repairs will be the responsibility of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council operates the Tribal Health Authority/Health Education Program (also known as Division of Health Program) under existing P.L. 93-638; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Division of Health administers programs for eligible community members who reside on the White Mountain Apache Reservation through the following components: Community Health Representative Program; Patient Transportation Program; Alcohol/Aftercare Treatment Program and Apache Diabetes Wellness Center; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds it in the best interest of the Tribe to request the Indian Health Service to transfer the IHS City Center houses to the White Mountain Apache Tribe

through the Tribal Health Authority/Health Education Program (also known as Division of Health Program) under existing P.L. 93-638.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe does hereby approve this request for transfer of houses located in city center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, this Resolution shall be declared null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Acting Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. In the event that the Chairman fails to delegate signatory authority to an Acting Chairman, the Vice-Chairman may sign.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>PANYEMPSES</u>. 1, 1943 July adopted by a variety <u>SEE</u> for and <u>MSRO</u> against and <u>MRRO</u> abstentions by the Tribat Cenacip of the Vibrat Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vestes in it by which is', Section I (a), (b), (c) and (u) of the Tribal Constitution, ratioled by the Triba September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the parameter on Sevember 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 48, 1994 (48 Sept. 984).
