

WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Approving the Application for a Temporary Permit for Commercial Filming within the Exterior Boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation)

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe (WMAT) Game & Fish Department and Mark Peterson of MVP Outdoor Adventures (via telephone) did this day come before the Tribal Council to request approval of the application for a Temporary Permit for Commercial Filming within the Exterior Boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the purpose of filming a current Trophy Elk Hunt client [Gerald Parnell, second hunt (September 18 24, 2014), West End Camp] for broadcast on the show Limited Access which is featured on the Sportsman Channel, as attached and incorporated by this reference; and
- WHEREAS, MVP Outdoors has agreed to all terms, conditions and fees associated with the completed and attached Project Proposal letter and application for a Temporary Permit for Commercial Filming within the Exterior Boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, The WMAT Game & Fish Department has concluded that such filming projects provide positive and economically beneficial exposure of the Tribe and WMAT Game & Fish management of reservation wildlife resources; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Council has reviewed the above mentioned Project Proposal Letter and application for a Temporary Permit for Commercial Filming within the Exterior Boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the purpose of filming a current Trophy Elk Hunt client [Gerald Parnell, second hunt (September 18 24, 2014), West End Camp] for broadcast on the show Limited Access which is featured on the Sportsman Channel, as attached and incorporated by this reference; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Council finds that the above mentioned Proposed Project and application for a Temporary Permit for Commercial Filming within the Exterior Boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are in the best interests of the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the above mentioned Proposed Project and application for a Temporary Permit for Commercial Filming within the Exterior Boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>SEPTEMBER 15, 2014</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for, <u>ZERO</u> against, and <u>ONE</u> abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
