(Approving Forest Management Deduction Expenditure Plan 2017-2018, Addendum #1)

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) and 1(s) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, as per 25 U.S.C. § 3105(c), the White Mountain Apache Tribe is eligible to receive money by withholding sales proceeds from timber harvested and lumber sold on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and money generated from such withholdings related to forest land management activities are placed into the <u>Forest Management Deduction Account</u> (FM7628FR8); and
- WHEREAS, Public Law 101-630, part 163.35, authorizes the establishment of an Indian Forest Land Assistance Account for the White Mountain Apache Tribe and unobligated forestry funds from non-federal sources relating to activities on or for Indian forest land like donations, contributions, user fees and/or funds transferred under Federal Interagency Agreements; and unused funds from such activities are placed into the <u>Indian Forest Land Assistance Account</u> (FL7530700) to be utilized for the purposes they were intended; and
- WHEREAS, funds collected to pay for the completion of special, contractual requirements (logging road maintenance and construction) for which money was paid by the purchaser (FATCO); and funds were placed in the Forest Projects (Road Maintenance) Account (FP7823FR6); and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed the Forest Management Deduction Expenditure Plan Addendum #1, from May 1, 2017 to April 30, 2018, as attached and incorporated by this reference; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that the addendum to the Plan should be approved and the use of funding sources coincide, respectively, with the accounts identified within the Plan to include any added interest earned during the course of the expenditure plan approval process; and

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it herby approves the Forest Management Deduction Expenditure Plan, Addendum #1 of **\$165,703.93** plus any accrued interest earned to date, respectively.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the deferred funds from the <u>Forest Management Deduction Account</u> (FM7628FR8) of **\$301,052.36** will be used to cover the Forest Management Projects (Slash/Burn) Account repayment balance in arrears of **\$159,511.58**. The remaining balance of the Forest Management Deductions will be **\$141,540.78**. This balance will be deferred for future use to cover Forest Management Expenses of Tribal Forestry in FY 2018 through 2019.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that **\$159,511.58** will be paid to the lockbox Forest Projects (slash/burning) Account #FP7824FR4, in Atlanta, GA maintained by the Office of Special Trustee (OST)

for future Slash/Burning expenses.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the <u>Indian Forest Land Assistance Account</u> (FL7530700) of **\$343.53 plus any accrued interest** will be used to pay for a one-time expense for accounting activities incurred by the Tribe. The Tribal Treasure will provide an invoice for reimbursement, not to exceed available amount, for accounting services provided in relation to this resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the <u>Forest Projects (Road Maintenance) Account</u> (FP7823FR6) of **\$5,848.82 plus any accrued interest** will be use to pay for WMATCO road maintenance or construction expenses incurred. WMATCO will provide an invoice to the Tribal Treasure for reimbursement, not to exceed available amount, of road maintenance or construction expenses incurred from either Lone Pine or Tonto South Timber Sale contract.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on **DECEMBER 13, 2017** duly adopted by a vote of **ELEVEN** for, **ZERO** against, and **ZERO** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

The tribe will be paid \$343.53 for this Addendum for administrative assistance provided to the Tribal Forestry program. Funds will be paid to the tribe at a one-time rate of \$343.53. For the amount indicated, the tribe will provide accounting, personnel, and other support services needed to obligate and track funds as prescribed in this plan.

Vouchers will be verified for accuracy by the Tribe. Reimbursement requests will be submitted to the agency superintendent for processing a wire transfer to the tribal government account.
