



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Authorizing the Police Department to Submit a Grant Application for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (“JAG”) Program - FY2019 Local Solicitation)

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(j) that the Tribal Council (“Council”) shall exercise the power “To accept grants and donations from any person, State or the United States”; and

WHEREAS, For fiscal year 2019, a funding opportunity exists through the United States Department of Justice (“DOJ”) for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (“JAG”) Program, which funds may be used to develop, enhance, and improve the White Mountain Apache Tribe’s justice programs and services; and

WHEREAS, The JAG does not require a Tribal cost match; and

WHEREAS, If awarded, the SORNA Program and Police Department will utilize the funds to enhance and continue program efforts to increase awareness and promote safety; and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council has reviewed the proposal by the White Mountain Apache Police Department and finds that approving the submission of a grant application for the FY2019 Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Grant Program Local Solicitation will assist the Tribe in improving its justice system, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the White Mountain Apache Police Department to prepare and submit a grant application to the United States Department of Justice for the Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program, and instructs the Police Department to make a complete and timely submission of the same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the acceptance of grant funding, if awarded, and instructs the Tribal Treasurer and the Police Department to establish a budget for receipt and expenditure of funds.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairwoman, or in her absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on **AUGUST 22, 2019** duly adopted by a vote of **TEN** for, **ZERO** against, and **ONE** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
