

## WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

## A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Authorizing the Tribe's Planning Department to Pursue the US Economic Development Administration's American Rescue Plan Act Indigenous Communities Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant)

- WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe") of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(j) that the Tribal Council ("Council") shall exercise the power, "To accept grants and donations from any person, State, or the United States"; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribe has directed the Tribal Planning Department to locate and seek after grant opportunities; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribe's consultant has located several potential opportunities, and this day, presented them to the Council for their direction and approval; and
- WHEREAS, Among the grant opportunities presented is the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA")
  Indigenous Communities Economic Adjustment Grant, offered by the U.S. Economic
  Development Administration, which is offering a grant program of between \$500,000.00
  and \$5 million, with no Tribal match requirement; and
- WHEREAS, The Council has reviewed this grant opportunity and finds that authorizing the Planning Department to pursue it is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Planning Department to make a complete and timely submission for the Economic Development Administration's Indigenous Communities Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event that the grant is awarded to the Tribe, the Planning Department is authorized to accept it and shall work with the Finance Department to develop a budget for receipts and expenditures thereof.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

## Resolution No. <u>11-2021-248</u>

The foregoing resolution was on **NOVEMBER 10, 2021** duly adopted by a vote of **NINE** for, **ZERO** against, and **ONE** abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
