WHEREAS, pursuant to Article XI, Section 3, of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the Secretary of the Tribal Council is responsible for keeping and maintaining minutes of

all Council meetings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article XIII, Section 5 of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache

Tribe, the order of business requires a reading of the minutes; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council Secretary requested approval of the attached meeting minutes prepared

from the Tribal Council meetings held on June 2, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds it in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to

approve the meeting minutes from the Tribal Council meetings held on June 2, 2022, as

prepared and presented by the Tribal Council Secretary.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the briefs with supporting meeting minutes from the Tribal Council meetings held on June 2, 2022, as prepared and presented by the Tribal Council Secretary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>AUGUST 3, 2022</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for, <u>ZERO</u> against, and <u>ONE</u> abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

CALL TO ORDER

- A. The meeting was called to order at 9:13 A.M. by Tribal Chairman Velasquez

- A. Update Rural Water System (Executive Session) KeAloha Douma

 Motion by Verna Westover, seconded by Renaldo Dazen to go into Executive Session

 Motion by Aubrey Aday, seconded by Mariddie Craig to come out of Executive Session
 - Resolution was presented to Allocating \$6.5 Million of the Tribe's American Rescue Plan Act Funds for the White Mountain Apache Tribe's Rural Water System Project

- B. Update Federal Lobbying Ryan Smith and Sarah Murray
 Ryan Smith introduced himself saying that he grew up in Washington and loves this
 place. He stated that in the pass they have had issues with the legislation regarding the
 Rural Water System. There is a due process. The Council often ask, why is this taking so
 long? What are the issues? He said some of the problems are the design work. The
 language is very important. Chairman Velasquez introduced Sarah Murray and said she
 has a wealth of knowledge and felt comfortable on what the Tribe needs and her
 capabilities to help the Tribe. Sarah said there are a lot of opportunities that could
 benefit the tribe. She said she's from South Dakota and graduated in 2007. She is more
 than willing to help with the COPS Grant and said she can get with Anthony Attorney
 General to list and identify the grants to assist the Tribe. But she is very thankful for the
 opportunity to work with the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
