

## WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Supporting and Authorizing Johns Hopkins Center for Indigenous Health to Apply for the Centers for Disease Control – Board Advisory Announcement for Staphylococcus Aureus Grant)

- WHEREAS, Pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe"), *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority "[t]o represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe", and in Article IV, Section 1(j), "[t]o accept grants and donations from any person, state, or the United States"; and
- WHEREAS, The Tribe, in conjunction with Johns Hopkins University ("JHU"), has conducted research projects on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation ("Reservation") for more than 40 years with the purpose of raising the level of health of all Reservation residents; and
- **WHEREAS,** The Tribe and JHU have worked effortlessly to address the health disparities and inequalities among the White Mountain Apache people; and
- **WHEREAS,** The carriage study activities measuring (resolution #12-2016-245 & resolution #08-2022-209) and preventing (Resolution # 07-2020-148) *Staphylococcus aureus* were previously approved and are currently in progress; and
- **WHEREAS,** Johns Hopkins Center for Indigenous Health ("JHCIH") is requesting approval to submit a new grant application to the Centers for Disease Control to develop the laboratory methods for measuring bacterial load of *Staphylococcus aureus*; and
- WHEREAS, the grant will fund the following project activities:
  - 1) From the two carriage studies, we will detect and quantify *S. aureus* in stored nasal and throat samples collected from children and adults using a variety of methods to determine which are most accurate;
  - 2) From the NARCH XI project, we will validate the methods identified in activity #1 in select samples collected from study participants; and
- WHEREAS, Data analyses will be de-identified and maintained with the highest standards of confidentiality; and
- **WHEREAS,** When analyses are complete, the JHU study team will share the findings with the Tribal Council and the Health Board; and
- **WHEREAS,** The Council has reviewed and considered JHCIH's request and finds that applying for the grant funding to conduct the proposed study activities is essential to better understand the burden of *staphylococcus aureus* among the community and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

## Resolution No. 06-2023-142

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Johns Hopkins Center for Indigenous Health to apply for the Centers for Disease Control – Board Advisory Announcement grant for the *Staphylococcus Aureus* activities identified for this study.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>JUNE 7, 2023</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for, <u>ZERO</u> against, and <u>ZERO</u> abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on November 10, 2021, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
