



WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

A Sovereign Tribal Nation

(Authorizing the Name of Fire Station No. 840 in Cedar Creek as the "Roger Clawson Fire Station")

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe ("Tribe") of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation provides, at Article IV, Section 1(h) that the Tribal Council ("Council") shall exercise the power, "[t]o regulate the uses and disposition of Tribal property"; and

WHEREAS, Fire Station No. 840 in Cedar Creek, AZ is currently in operation; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Roger Clawson was the last fireman to provide fire response and emergency services to the Cedar Creek community and the John F. Kennedy School in Cedar Creek, AZ; and

WHEREAS, The Council finds that naming Fire Station No. 840 in Cedar Creek as the "Roger Clawson Fire Station" is an appropriate name, paying tribute to Mr. Roger Clawson's dedication and service to the community, and is in the best interests of the Tribe and its members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that, effective immediately, it hereby names Fire Station No. 840 in Cedar Creek, AZ, as the "Roger Clawson Fire Station."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or Federal Laws, or any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on FEBRUARY 6, 2024 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for, ZERO against, and ZERO abstentions by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1, of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on November 10, 2021, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
